So you can reunite with your loved ones in case of a disaster, identify your own meeting places and know the evacuation sites for school and work. Please communicate your needs in an emergency to at least 2 neighbors or friends in your own community.

If you and your loved ones want to contact each other during or after a disaster, each person should call the designated contact person to report his/her location and condition. This contact should be out-of-state because it is often easier to call long distance after a disaster.
